Topic – Moving Along

<u>Theme of the week: JOURNEYS</u> <u>We're going on a journey</u>

Day Board:

Themed Activities to do:

- Take a journey, a walk with your family. Talk about what you can see. When you get back draw a picture of something that interested you:

 some birds, a big lorry, a nice house, someone's dog.
- Draw a map of your bedroom, house, garden or even a treasure map! Can you use your map to get around? What sort of things will you put on your map? Where is the treasure?



- Can you pretend to be a Travel Agent? Ask your family where they want to go? Make some brochures, draw pictures of where they want to go: beaches, castles, mountains. Set up a desk.
 Make some tickets.
- Look at an Atlas or watch/listen to a programme about a different country with your family. Talk about different countries around the world, how are they different? What animals live there?

- Go on a "journey" around your house or garden. Can you find 6 things that are the same? 6 leaves, 6 pencils, 6 stones?
 Can you put them into 2 groups and make 6 in different ways? 2 and 4, 3 and 3, 5 and 1.
- Put some numbers on some cars. Make a road outside with chalk, or on paper. Can you put your cars in order? Make a car park, number the spaces. Can you put the cars in the correct spaces?



Science

If available get some cars (or marbles or balls) Make some ramps using carboard tubes, books, wooden planks, old guttering. Experiment with the different vehicles/ramps and tubes. How far do they travel? What happens when you use small cars/big cars/a smooth ramp/a rough ramp/a lower ramp/a higher ramp/long tube/short tube. Measure far things travel.

English


- Practising pencil control by drawing a map of your bedroom, home, garden or treasure map. What sort of things will you add to your map?
- Can you think of any words that rhyme with map? [cap, tap, nap, gap]
- Phonics: Introduce the letter 'o' What sound does it make? What does the letter look like? How do we write it? What objects begin with 'o' [orange, octopus, off, on etc.]

Listen to the Story:

We're Going on a Bear Hunt

- See if you can join in with
 the parts that are repeated 'We're going
 on a bear hunt, we're going to catch a big
 one...'
 - Can you act out the story yourselves whilst out for a walk. Pretend you are looking for the bear. See if you find some long wavy grass to walk through.
- See if you can try doing some of <u>these</u> activities at home.
