


Remote-learning



Year Group: Year 1	WEEK BEGINNING: 02/11/20
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This is an overview of the main areas of learning in Year 1 for this week which will link to the learning going on in school. Please use these as the main activities for remote-learning if your child is unable to attend school during this week.

<h3>Maths</h3> <h4>Oak Academy: Number Bonds</h4> <p>LESSON 1- Counting sets within 10 LESSON 2- Recognising number bonds to five and six LESSON 3- Recognising number bonds to seven and eight LESSON 4- Recognising number bonds to nine and ten</p> <p>Lesson 5 – Write out your number bonds to 10. Once you have written them out can you come up with a way to remember them, this could be in a song (like Farmer Pete’s), a picture or a rhyme.</p> <h4>Mental fluency:</h4> <p>Practise your 2’s and 5’s rolling numbers each day, can you get quicker each time? Learn the Farmer Pete Song to help you with your number bonds to 10! Practice them using the BondBubbles 2Do task on PurpleMash.</p> <h4>Challenge:</h4> <p>Get a grown-up to time you, how quick can you write down all your number bonds to 10. Practise this at least 3 times in the week, can you get quicker each time?</p>	 <p>Number Bonds to 10</p> <p>0 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10</p> <p>NOM NOM KIDS</p>	<h3>English</h3> <p>LESSON 1 - Watch this video, think about the sounds that you hear in the video. On a piece of paper can you write down a list of words to represent the sound of fireworks e.g. pop, whizz, bang etc.</p> <p>LESSON 2 - Watch this video on rhyming words. What rhyming words can you think of? Can you write a list of rhyming words? E.g. cat and hat, mouse and house.</p> <p>LESSON 3 – Re-watch the video on rhyming words. Can you think of and write down words to rhyme with the following words: boom, fizz, pop, band, loud and crack?</p> <p>LESSON 4 - Create your own 5 line poem on fireworks. E.g. <i>Fireworks boom, Fireworks zoom, Fireworks go flash in the sky, Fireworks fly really high, I love fireworks.</i> Your poem doesn’t have to rhyme but you can challenge yourself to make it rhyme if you can. You can write your poem up in the 2Do on PurpleMash.</p> <p>LESSON 5 – draw a picture to go with your firework poem. Can you perform your poem to someone in your home?</p> 
<h3>Irresistible Learning- Autumn and Bonfire Night</h3> <p>Lesson One- Can you remember what season we are in? How do we know? What are the features of Autumn? Have a look outside, what can you see? How can you tell that we are in Autumn? Can you draw some Autumn leaves?</p> <p>Lesson Two- use this link to help why we celebrate Bonfire night and what we do to celebrate. Can you think about how we can stay safe at Bonfire night? Tell a grown up how you think you can stay safe. After this have a go at creating your own firework picture – you could maybe use chalk or paint, if you have some at home, to make the fireworks nice and bright or you can create it on the 2Do task on PurpleMash.</p>	 	<h4>Phonics:</h4> <p>Recap your sounds by watching this video. This week our tricky words are we and me. Practise saying the words and writing them. You could make some flashcards to help you. Challenge: Can you put your tricky words in to a sentence. This week we are focusing on the sounds air and ear. Look at the videos to help you practise these sounds. Which words do you know that have these sounds?</p> <h4>Wellbeing – Remembrance</h4> <p>Every year we celebrate Remembrance Day – on this day we celebrate the lives of all those who have fought in the war. The symbol for Remembrance Day is a poppy. For your well-being task this week we would like you to research why the poppy is the symbol of Remembrance Day and then to paint/draw a poppy – you could do this on a piece of paper or on a pebble.</p>
