Josiah Wedgwood was very involved in the planning of canals in his local area, which was Staffordshire. The local canal network was to prove very important to the Wedgwood Company, for both transporting raw materials and the fragile finished goods across the country.

Task

Sketch a piece of pottery for the Wedgwood collection. Use the photographs of the pottery range that you researched last week to inspire your design.



Your drawing should include:

- The object sketched from two different angles.
- A border pattern around the edge and a picture in the centre.
- Colour blending to create the correct blue tones.

Science

This is a very cool, simple and fun experiment, and also completely safe, just don't drink the water! You need: • Warm Water • Oil • A Tall Glass • Food Colouring

Method

- 1. Fill the tall glass with warm water.
- 2. Pour a small amount of oil into another container and add a few drops of food colouring.
- 3. Give it a good stir, if it doesn't mix, add a bit of water.
- 4. Pour the food colouring and oil mixture into the warm water and watch the fireworks!
